Grapevine open talk CDs were donated to homebound AA members. The Committee will renew fourteen (14) Grapevine subscriptions. News From Around A.A.: There was an article posted in the Toronto Star earlier this month titled "Does religion belong at AA? Fight over 'God' splits Toronto AA groups." The article covers a conflict between some local A.A. groups and the intergroup office. There was a lot to get excited about in the article and it is easy to see how members on both sides of the controversy got worked up but the real damage being done has nothing to do with issue being discussed. The problem, as I see it, is that members are publicly taking sides on a controversial issue and doing so as members of A.A. This is the very thing that destroyed the Washingtonian movement. The issue is one that each side is passionate about and I understand their emotion. We have seen similar emotion on opposite sides of an issue in our own group conscience, this is common. But when we hold to our position, make it sacred and close our minds then we have lost sight of our principles, our singleness of purpose is gone. I believe that this kind of public controversy is a real risk to the survival of A.A.
